Strengthen the Knees that are Weak

Hebrews 12:1-17; Proverbs 15:5-12,31-33;

Matthew 7:1-6

- 1. Accept rebuke
 - a. Rejecting rebuke takes you away from Christ
 - b. Christian wisdom "welcomes" rebuke
- 2. Correct your brothers and sisters with love
 - a. Start by taking the beam out of your own eye
 - Recognize that different levels of offence call for different responses
 - c. Do not exchange godly rebuke for gossip
- 3. Encourage Christ's people
 - a. Remember difference between legal and gospel obedience
 - b. Rebuke only takes us as far as legal obedience
 - Need to encourage one another to gospel service of Christ
